

Part-Time Peer Support Worker (Indigenous Mental Health & Addictions Program - IMHAP) (Contract end date March 31, 2026)

The Ne-Chee Friendship Centre requires a Peer Support Worker <u>with lived experience</u> to assist in the delivery of the **Indigenous Mental Health & Addiction Support Program.** This program aims to provide culturally relevant front-line mental health and addiction interventions and supports for Indigenous Clients in conflict with the law, with an enhanced focus on vulnerable women.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Support the Counsellor to deliver group mental health and addiction programming as well as crisis support for participants of IMHAP
- Collaborate with the Counsellor to develop client-centered, trauma-informed safety and wellness plans, and harm reduction plans
- Identify and address barriers to group programming to improve participant understanding and engagement
- Ensure that group programming materials and craft supplies are readily available and accessible to each participant
- Promote life-skill development to foster healing, wholistic wellness, recovery and to enhance participant safety
- Complete administrative duties and documentation as required
- Other duties as assigned by the Counsellor and/or designate
- Vulnerable Persons Check (upon offer of employment)
- Driver's licence and reliable vehicle is a definite asset

Salary: \$17.20/hr- approximately 15 hours per week.
