## What to expect from the Circle of Care team

**First Court Appearances:** The youth/young adult will be assigned a case manager.

### **Wellness Intakes:**

Will be conducted with the youth/young adult to build trusted rapport and open communication

### **Community Healing**

#### **Discussions:**

A holistic discussion in court with input from Elders/Traditional Knowledge Advisors to develop a suited care plan

### **Circle of Care Plans:**

Tailored to the youth/young adult with an aim to address the underlying root causes that have brought them into the Criminal Justice System and to identify healing and wellness goals



**Using a trauma-informed approach, the Circle of Care team will work with eligible Justice Centre participants to provide support and active case management focused on restoration and healing**

**Through a holistic and flexible approach, the Kenora Justice Centre increases referrals to existing Indigenous restorative justice and diversion programs, reduces bail and remand populations and provides multi-sectoral trauma-informed supports delivered by Indigenous organizations and cross-sector service providers to youth and young adults.**
