The Ne-Chee Friendship Centre is seeking a **Peer Support Worker with lived experience** to support the delivery of the **Indigenous Mental Health & Addiction Support Program (IMHAP)**. This program provides culturally relevant, front-line mental health and addiction supports for Indigenous clients involved in the justice system, with a focus on supporting vulnerable women.

#### **KEY RESPONSIBILITIES**

- Work alongside the Counsellor to deliver weekly group programming sessions and provide compassionate crisis support
- Help create a safe, welcoming space where participants feel comfortable learning and sharing
- Support participants in overcoming barriers to attending and engaging in programming
- Assist in the development of wellness, safety and harm reduction plans with participants
- Prepare and organize workshop materials and supplies to ensure smooth program delivery
- Assist with basic documentation and administrative tasks

#### **QUALIFICATIONS**

- Must have lived experience related to mental health and/or addictions, and comfortable sharing in a supportive environment
- Strong teamwork skills; respectful, reliable and able to build genuine connections with others
- Vulnerable Sector Check (required upon offer of employment)
