The purpose of this program is to support the reintegration of Indigenous women from the provincial correctional system safely back into their communities.

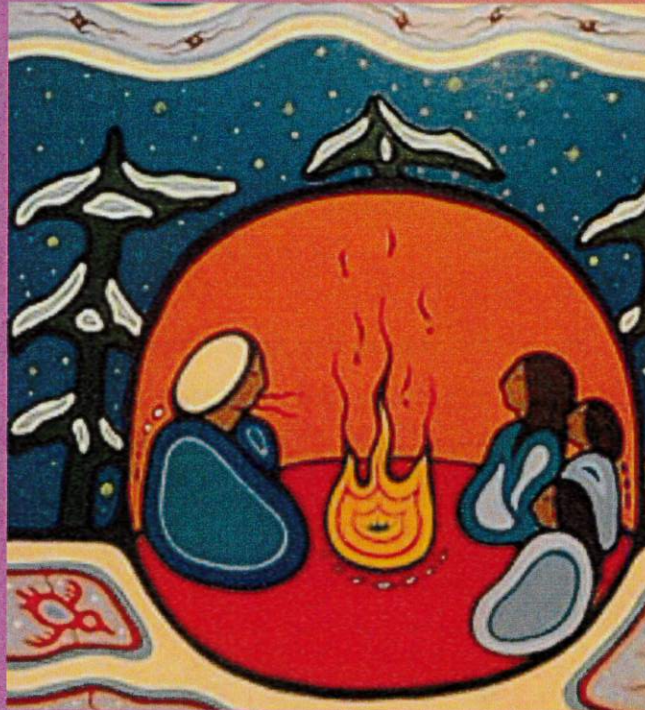
A wewena Ngiiwewinaa worker will work with Indigenous women to:

- Provide connections and referrals to community resources

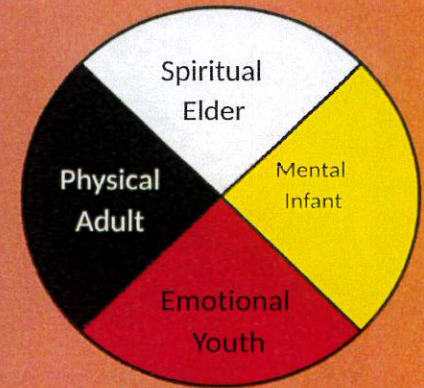
We Promote healing by supporting the 3 R's

Indigenous languages, Culture, and positive Indigenous identities



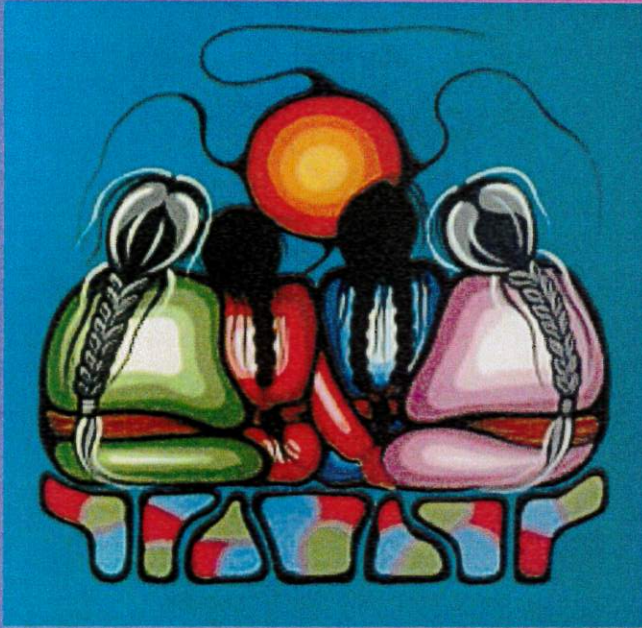
Through this program women will have opportunities and options to address their unique needs through appropriate Indigenous programming, supports and services

Medicine wheel.

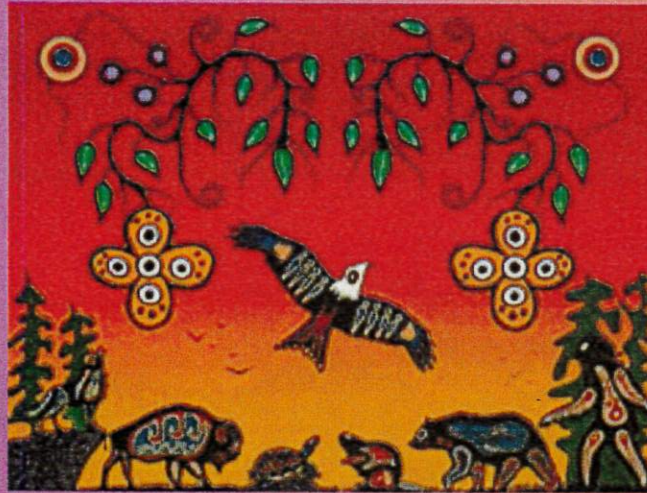

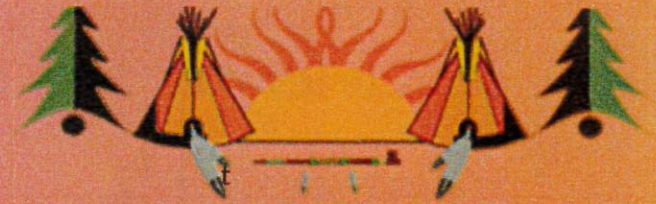
